Dealing with Frozen Windows

Use your ice scraper or defroster. Do not use hot water, as it may cause the windows to crack.

• Windshield Wipers

Ensure that your wiper fluid is already mixed with antifreeze. Spray a few times to fill the entire system with the antifreeze fluid. In freezing conditions, check that the windshield wipers are not frozen. If your 2-horse van is parked outdoors, consider placing a cork under the wiper arm to prevent contact between the wiper and the window.

Doors

Always keep defrosting agents on hand for frozen locks and doors. These can be purchased at service stations along the highway. To prevent freezing, coat rubbers and doors with talcum powder or silicone spray.

Fuel Tank

Winterize diesel engines by using winter diesel, which prevents fuel from solidifying in cold temperatures. Keep your diesel tank as full as possible to minimize condensation.

Water System

If your Krismar 2-horse is equipped with a water tank, remember to drain it before winter. Disconnect the hose from the faucet and open the tap to release any pressure in the line. Leave the faucet open.



Winter Driving Tips

- → Keep your lights free from snow and dirt.
- → Avoid short trips whenever possible. Cold weather accelerates battery discharge, and short journeys may not provide enough time for a full recharge.
- → Carry snow chains and check the regulations for each country, as some may require or prohibit their use.

In winter conditions, slippery surfaces can make loading and unloading your horses dangerous. Having a small bucket of road salt within reach upon arrival can make a big difference, ensuring that you can do this safely and without risk.
